



Band place on record its sincere appreciation of the services rendered the Band by Mr A E Sutcliffe coaching young players and that hearty congratulations be extended to him on his fine performance given by the boys on their initial appearance before the Public on Dec 21<sup>st</sup>

Chidlington's Mr H G Brownlee advised that Mr Chidlington's Medal for the most improved player during the past 3 months had been awarded to A O'Brien.

At the request of the Chairman Mr Burk made the presentation and after thanking the Chairman for the privilege expressed his approval of the idea. The boys would form the nucleus of a senior Band and their initial success promised well for the future. It was essential that the boys keep up their practice and listen to their tutor. He complimented the winner on his success and expressed the hope that every boy would strive to attain musical perfection.

Mr H G Brownlee stated that a medal was being awarded every 3 months.

Addressing the meeting at the request of the Chairman Mr Burk assured the Band that it had the support of himself and His Worship the Mayor. He thanked the older Bandmen for their efforts in keeping the Band together. There was nothing to worry over in the financial position of the Band and great credit was due to Chidlington and A E Sutcliffe for the training of the boys and especially to Mr Sutcliffe for the successful debut of those boys. The honorariums granted were small and he considered that a town of 4000 should be in a position to pay a reasonable remuneration to those who put the work

into the Band. The public interest had been aroused and he felt that the time was opportune to place the Borough subsidy on a better footing. Referring to the deed of Trust governing the interests Mr Burk said he was of the opinion that better arrangements could be made and he considered that the instruments should be vested in the Band and in the event of the Band winding up the assets should vest in the Council for the future revival of the Band. He suggested that a sub-committee be set up to meet the Trustees & himself after the vacation with a view to placing the Band on a better foundation and enabling it to Budget satisfactorily for the year. Permission had been given for the Band to play out on Xmas Eve and after extending the Council's best wishes for success assured them again of his support.

Mr McDonald said Mr Burk's remarks confirmed his statement earlier in the evening and he felt sure that the Band would always be treated as gentlemen.

Messrs McDonald, Brownlee, Huddington and  
Abutillife were appointed the sub-  
Committee as suggested by Mr Burk.

#### Collection

The Secretary reported that the Collection on Sunday evening amounted to £54/3 and 9/- further had been received.

Mr HG. Brownlee said that Mr Huddington  
proposed to stage an effort for the  
Band next year. He thought that should  
more social life be brought into the Band  
it would progress.

M' Brien asked why Honorary members Tickets.  
Say at sf had not been issued.

M' Mortimer said that previously Hon. Members.  
Tickets had been set out and later a canvass  
made of the town. The result had not been  
good.

M' E Brownlee said that the Band had  
agreed not to make any appeal while  
the Patriotic Effort was on.

A. Sutcliffe The President as a mark of his appreciation  
of Mr Sutcliffe's services made him a personal  
presentation.

Deputations A deputation of Messrs F Wilson, H N Dowell &  
A Sutcliffe representing Citizens interested in  
the welfare of a Band in Thame was  
welcomed by the Chairman.

M' Dowell said the deputation assured the  
Band that it was willing to assist the  
Band. The Band had passed through  
bad times and he suggested that a  
Ladies Committee could be formed to  
assist any band effort.

M' Wilson endorsing M' Dowell's remarks said  
he was pleased that the Band had been  
reformed and he would be pleased to assist  
in anyway at all.

M' A Sutcliffe assured the Band of his support  
and suggested that a canvass of Honorary  
Members should be made. He felt sure  
that the people of Thame would be  
only too willing to assist.

The Secretary said the question of a Ladies  
Committee had been under discussion.

M' Mortimer considered that the Band was  
lacking in Social Activities and with the  
aid of a Ladies Committee this could be  
overcome.

M<sup>r</sup> H Brownlee agreed with M<sup>r</sup> Mortimer and said there was no doubt a Ladies Committee would be a wonderful asset to the Band. The Chairman said he appreciated the interest being taken in the Band and thanked the delegation for their offer of assistance. He assured them that their offer would be availed. After referring to social activities in connection with the City Boys Band he felt sure similar functions would place the Band on a better footing. The Band was now in a position to show the people something and he felt sure that the new boys would receive every assistance and consideration in up holding the wonderful record of the Band. M<sup>r</sup> H Brownlee said everything was moving on right lines and after the holidays an effort could be made to form a ladies Committee. The delegation and Ladies Committee could meet the Band Committee and from now on the Band could look to the future with confidence.

#### Thanks

The Chairman said he would like to thank the Fire Brigade for providing collectors on Sunday evening. It was typical of the willing assistance rendered by the Fire Brigade over many years.

M<sup>r</sup> H Brownlee said the Band would be playing out on Xmas eve and permission to take up a collection had been granted. The collections would be divided between the Boys, M<sup>r</sup> Satchiffe & the Band and if the Brigade could again assist it would be appreciated.

M<sup>r</sup> Wilton said he would like to thank the Band for electing him a Vice President. Acknowledging his election as a tribute to

the Brigade and on honour to himself he assured the Band that every member of the Brigade was Keen on the Band. While it might be difficult to provide collectors on Xmas Eve on account of work he felt sure that the Auxiliary Members would help them out. He would like to congratulate the Band on the Sacred Concert and expressed the opinion that it was a wonderful performance.

The President extended Seasonal Greetings to those present and the meeting closed.
