"That a letter of thanks be sent to Mr. F. Wilton for the loan of his uniform to the Drum Major for the Contest held at Easter."

"That Secretary be authorised to pay Mr. Chilton for Hall cleaning."
"That Secretary be authorised to draw the sum of £2-10-0 for Petty Cash."

"Hat Badges. That offer of Mr. Wright of donation of £5-0-0 toward the cost of hat badges be accepted with grateful thanks."

"That account for hat badges £21-10-0 be passed for payment."

"That the Extraordinary General Meeting . be held on Monday evening, the 15th May, 1950, to present Balance Sheet to members of the Band....The Band was to be notified to that effect the following practice night!"

"This was after the Revenue a/c and Balance Sheet had been read and discussed by the members of the Committee."

"Re F. Flowers who was taking part in the Wellington Contest during the School holidays.....That Bandmaster's action in loaning instrument to Fred Flowers be approved." "That a letter wishing him luck in his venture be sent to Fred."

"That a letter be sent to Mr. R.V. Rowe thanking him and in appreciation of his services to the Band as Hon. Auditor."

"That all cheques of the Thames Citizens' Band be signed by any two of the following: Mr. K.D. Wright, President; Miss. M.J. Johnston, Sec-Treasurer; Mr. A. Williams, Committeeman; and that Treasurer be authorised to endorse all cheques."

"A motion that a letter be sent to the Air Department enquiring re the availability of a uniform for the Drum Major was left in abeyance until such time as Mr. Wright obtained the necessary measurements."
